Red Center Report

• RED Center has been improving the notification process over the past few years. We

have come a long way in communicating with MABAS members on the activation processes. The RED center has been bringing Special Ops teams into a zoom conference call such as this one and the process has been going very well. Teams are texted a zoom link where the MABAS leadership is already in progress discussing the deployment. The team is briefed, and the IC is then brought into the call to provide more information for the response and coordination.

· We are moving away from the Everbridge conference call process due to a history of

issues we have had in controlling the meeting via a phone call. Zoom provides more technology and information sharing. The last deployment at 2:30 in the morning for the Hemlock Grain Fire, the RED center brought the Executive board, planners, and Coordinators into the zoom call instead of the usual Everbridge process. \circ It allowed everyone to share website links with the group

 $_{\odot}$ Communicate in a chat room while the conversation was in progress to Ask a question to the group and poll the attendees without any interruption using the chat room

- Attendees were able to provide their lists of resources available in the chat room which made documentation more accurate.
- Sharing screens of what was going on in real time was a huge help to coordinating the deployment.
- It was one of the best conference calls we have had so far, lasting 2.5 hours where attendees jumped on and off to do tasks.
- For the next February Executive roll call for this group, we will begin using a zoom link vs the Everbridge process. Everyone needs to join the zoom with your name and division # which will speed the process of the roll call attendance. We will provide any updates or announcements, take any questions, and then move to the radio roll call afterwards. Does anyone have any questions?
- The RED center is planning exercises often with Special Ops teams. We have 19

different types of Special Operation teams with more coming this year. Planning to get these teams exposed to the activation process is going to average about 1 team every two weeks. Doing at least two notification exercises each year with these teams is the goal.

· We would like to do division exercises also with strike teams and task forces where it

can be just a zoom conference call or physical assets are moved in the division to the POD. Getting the division dispatch center involved in the process are also exercises the RED Center will be planning. If there is a division that would like to do these exercises, please reach out to myself or Trent to coordinate a month to do this.

Communications Committee Report

• We have recently secured approval for our MABAS 101 class to teach dispatch centers on the concepts of MABAS, how to use it, what's it about, what are the box cards, how to use them, terminology, and exercises with the attendees.

• This course was submitted to the 911 training council and recently approved. Division Dispatch centers now will have the opportunity to send personnel and be reimbursed for their attendance. There is no cost for the class, MABAS is sponsoring the class.

• We all know everyone is short staffed and sending people to training costs money

including backfill. This will help centers recoup the costs for those trainings. • First class will be March 17th at the RED Center in Ann Arbor. A second class is being sought sometime in April in the Midland area and a third class in May possibly in Otsego.

- If you have a division dispatch center that is struggling to understand what you are trying to accomplish with your BOX cards or MABAS out of division deployments, please let me know. I can work with you in reaching out to those centers, having a meeting, and helping to explain some of the information along with providing some tips and tricks.
- Working with some of the division dispatch centers that are not participating in the monthly roll calls. Finding out
- Many don't know what the notification process is for and do not join
- Dispatchers hear the automated message and hang up not even listening to the message
- The center does not have 800MHz, so they thought they were not supposed to participate.
- There has been a change in the leadership, and we were not advised to change the notification to the new person
- Operating on VHF, MABAS can provide a portable for the center.
